Opening

It began with a mother's desire for her children to know what happened and to inherit reality they could build their lives on.

Eternity makes words

The phrase "Eternity makes words" belongs to the legacy of Dr. William Vincent Rees. He spent his life repairing bodies. Reconstructography extends that spirit into the realm of human understanding: a kind of careful surgery on the way a person sees their own life. Moments preserved with care can become words; words can become stories; stories can become legacy.

Michael's reminder

The Michael Rees Foundation is named in memory of Michael Rees, not to turn one life into a product, but to remember that every life contains more than the world sees. His story becomes an invitation to ask: whose story have we misunderstood because we lacked the evidence, context, or compassion to see it clearly?

The method and the promise

Evidence is the key. Understanding is the door. Wisdom is what lies beyond. Evidence alone is not enough. Understanding transforms evidence into meaning. Wisdom arrives when understanding is held with humility, compassion, courage, strength, and integrity.

Against oblivion

No life should be reduced to its silence. A faded photograph, a favorite song, a voicemail, a child's drawing, and an old hard drive can become small acts of resistance against oblivion when they are preserved and interpreted responsibly.

Welcome to your life

Reconstructography should help people say: "Wow, I forgot so much, and I understood it so differently at the time." It should help them revise understanding without shame. It should help them say, "It's okay." It should help them love themselves. It should help them live fully. Welcome to your life. You matter.
