Evidence-Based Character Reconstruction (EBCR) is a framework for understanding character through repeated observable patterns across time, not isolated events.

## What EBCR is not

EBCR is not diagnosis. It is not labeling. It is not moral branding. It is not a tool for reducing a person to their worst moment or most flattering memory.

## What EBCR does

EBCR organizes observable behaviors, evidence, contradictions, witness perspectives, and context to help reconstruct patterns of action over time. It asks what the evidence repeatedly shows rather than what a single story claims.

## Core principles

1. Character emerges through patterns.
2. Isolated incidents require caution.
3. Contradictory evidence remains visible.
4. Confidence must be explicit.
5. Context matters.
6. Behavior is reconstructed before interpretation.
7. Revision is expected when new evidence appears.
8. Human dignity remains intact regardless of conclusions.

## Why it matters

Many personal, legal, family, and historical narratives are distorted by isolated incidents, charisma, authority, trauma, or selective memory. EBCR helps resist distortion by requiring claims about character to be connected to observable evidence across time.

## Evidence categories

Relevant evidence may include documented actions, communications, repeated choices, decisions under pressure, patterns of care or neglect, consistency across contexts, witness accounts, records, and contradictions. Subjective experience can be preserved, but it should be labeled as subjective experience.

## Confidence

EBCR should present confidence rather than certainty. A pattern may be confirmed, likely, possible, disputed, contradicted, or insufficiently supported. The user should be able to inspect the evidence behind each characterization.

## **Ethical rule**

EBCR should reconstruct behavior rather than assign diagnoses. It should help people understand what happened and how patterns developed without claiming medical, psychiatric, or spiritual authority.
